

- A Marine Coordination
 Centre (MCC) is a central
 point for managing marine
 and offshore operations
 such as:
- Safe access to and from offshore platforms
- Construction activities
- Maintenance and servicing requirements
- Emergency Responses
- Weather and sea state monitoring
- Ensuring the location and safety of operatives

for offshore developers, operations and maintenance providers and local people training to access the offshore sector?


- Multiple training areas, offices and communal spaces

- Robust security features


Funding

DEVELOPINGTHE CELTIC SEA

- The Crown Estate (TCE) is responsible for the leasing of the seabed in the Celtic Sea Region for Offshore Wind Development.
- To aid the development of the region TCE established a £50m Supply Chain Accelerator fund.
- The aim of the fund is to catalyse the capacity and capability of the UK supply chain to support a thriving offshore wind industry.
- The development of the Celtic Sea is predicted to create 5300 jobs and a £1.4bn economic boost
