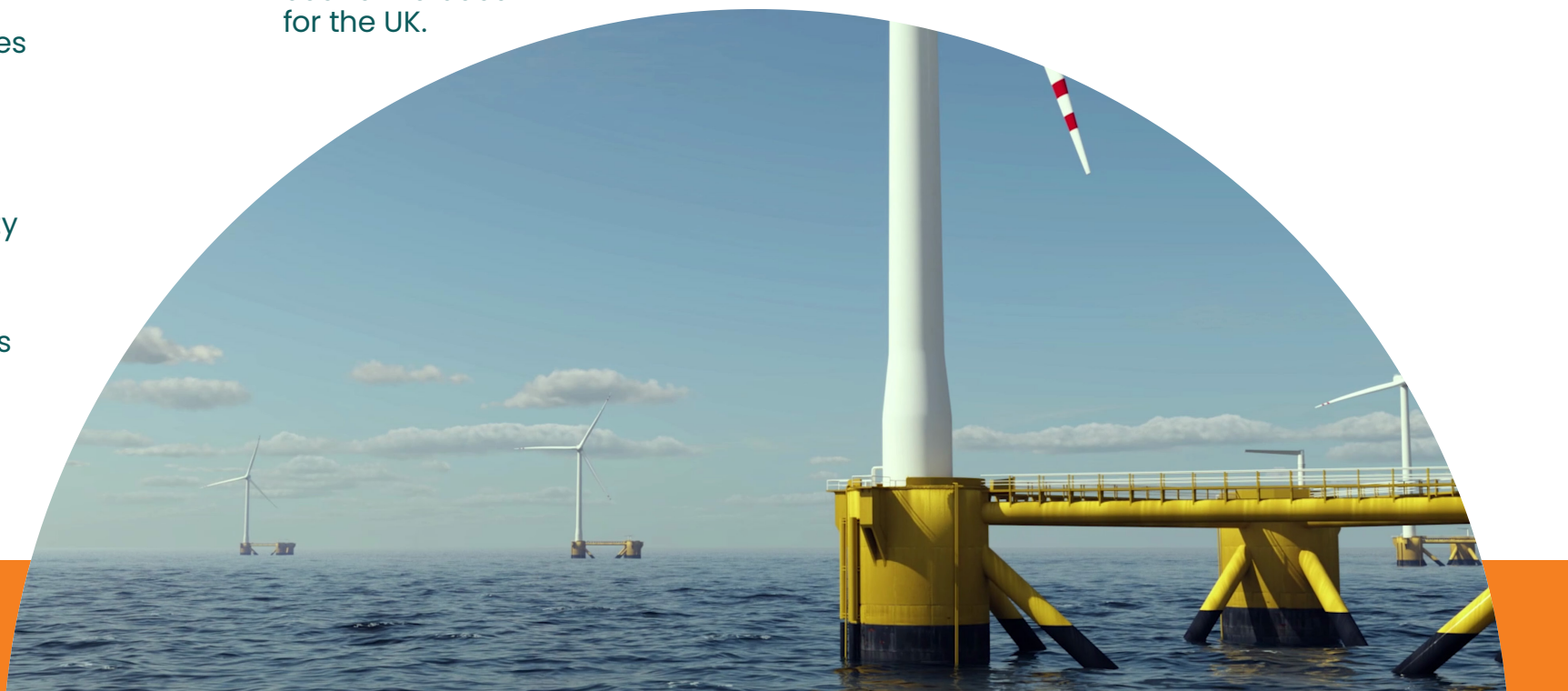
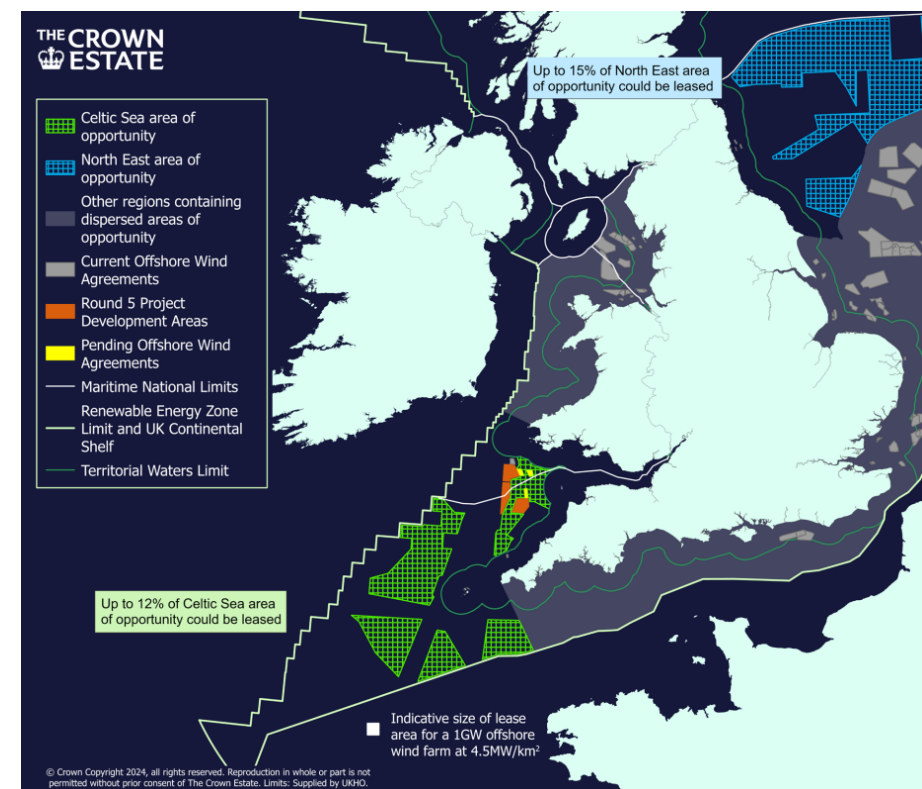

- ✓ The Crown Estate (TCE) is responsible for the leasing of the seabed in the Celtic Sea Region for Offshore Wind Development.
- ✓ To aid the development of the region TCE established a £50m Supply Chain Accelerator fund.
- ✓ The aim of the fund is to catalyse the capacity and capability of the UK supply chain to support a thriving offshore wind industry.
- ✓ The development of the Celtic Sea is predicted to create 5300 jobs and a £1.4bn economic boost for the UK.
